For Brigadoon of the Sixties: Revelry & Kerfuffles at the Oregon Country Fair

More information has come to light since I published "Brigadoon of the Sixties" in June 2019. Here are corrections and clarifications:

Chapter 6

Kent Cumbo's last name was misspelled with "K" on pages pages 90 and 91. And the photo on page 93 does not show Anita Sweeten. Instead, it shows Kent Cumbo's wife, Kim, bringing a hand-sewn Phoenix Rising sign to the Fair in 1981.

Chapter 8

Two photos from Jana Chase's collection were actually taken by Toes Tiranoff: The visit along the roadside on page 106, and the Chautauqua caravan on page 108. Both photos © 1991 Toes Tiranoff.

Chapter 10

The wrong pronunciation was given for Ibrahim Hamide's first name in "Brigadoon of the Sixties" on page 123. Known as Ib, his name is pronounced with a short "i" like in the word "rib."

Chapter 16

Sam "Zamara" Marshall's nickname was misspelled throughout pages 175-186.

Chapter 26

Elliott Farren was formerly known as Forrest Elliott-Farren. Forrest's first name was misspelled on pages 287-288. On page 287, the booth for kids was called Little People booth (without the "apostrophe s"). And on page 290, Jain Elliott says she never served on the Village Council.

The timeline for the Master Gardener program in Lane County (as described on page 296) was incomplete. Oregon State University Extension Program started the Master Gardener program in Lane County in 1976. After Lane County cut funding for the Extension Program in the early 1980s, voters passed a serial levy to keep the Master Gardening Program going on a shoestring.

Chapter 27

The Kent State shootings occurred on May 4, 1970. An incorrect year was listed on page 302.
